Highlands Islands and Speyside			
By far the biggest region, the Highlands inevitably embraces wide variations. The western part of the Highlands, at least on the mainland, has only a few scattered distilleries, and it is difficult to generalise about their character. If they have anything in common, it is a rounded, firm, dry character with some peatiness. The far north of the Highlands has several whiskies with a notably heathery, spicy character, probably deriving both from the local soil and the coastal location of the distilleries. The more sheltered East Highlands and the Midlands of Scotland (sometimes described as the South Highlands) have a number of notably fruity whiskies. None of these Highland areas is officially regarded as a region, but the area between them, known as Speyside is universally acknowledged as a heartland of malt distillation. The Speyside single malts are noted in general for their elegance and complexity, and often a refined smokiness.
